

RYP School Drive




Thank you to all those who participated in the RYP School Drive! It was the first year of this effort, meant to ensure that all of the students in our youth program had what they needed to start the school year.

Our emergency domestic violence shelter, Renewal House, remains at capacity.


Each year, many of our member congregations and others ask how they can support the families living there. We ask folks to donate gift cards, so that the adults there have the opportunity to do their own shopping.


We are truly grateful for all of our delegates and their shared commitment to racial, economic, and social justice.

Black Creatives Children's Book Fair Saturday, November 23, 2024 12:00pm - 5:00pm 140 Dudley St., Roxbury, MA



Restoring Roxbury's Meetinghouse


Final Touches
