To understand where we are now, we have to look back - even as we press forward. In unsettled times, the justice work of the UU Urban Ministry continues, steadfast. We support college-bound BIPOC students and domestic violence survivors rebuilding their lives. We partner with Roxbury organizations to walk together for a fairer future.

And still, we unearth and face a history that brought us to this place.

- We continue researching the lives of those enslaved by First Church Roxbury congregants. Our graduate fellow researchers are learning more about individuals who were enslaved, aiming to track their lineage to today.
- We bring this history to life in our after school program, working with Boston high school students to help them track their ancestors and celebrate their heritage.

- We imagine how to tell a fuller history to visitors when they enter our soon-to-be completely restored historic Meetinghouse.
- We convene Community Conversations to connect this history to injustices today that directly impact people of color.

This is work that you make possible.

Last month, we celebrated the life and legacy of Dr. Martin Luther King in our annual Ties that Bind concert with Opera unMet. We gathered in community, huddled together after a snowfall, and remembered how love and truth can, in the end, prevail against the odds.


This month, we are delighted to honor **Lea Anderson**, **delegate from First Parish in Wayland**, **as our Delegate of the Month!**



Final Touches






